FROM THE TUMUAKI ~ PRINCIPAL

As part of our Aotearoa New Zealand Histories programme, and one of our strategic goals, we have been focusing on our localised curriculum.

On Wednesday and Thursday 27-28 March, we all went out to this Naātira where we were welcomed with pōwhiri. This is a special place where we learned about the wharenui, and the strong link to Tāwhiao, the second Māori King. Many of us walked to the top of the urupā from where we could see over the Marae, and the whole valley. We learned about protocols of urupā and of Ngātira. We also learned about some of the history of the forestry in the area, and how the land was taken by Forest Products. Since we started Aotearoa New Zealand Histories programme, we have mainly been focusing on local history, and our visit to Ngātira Marae has added to our knowledge.
