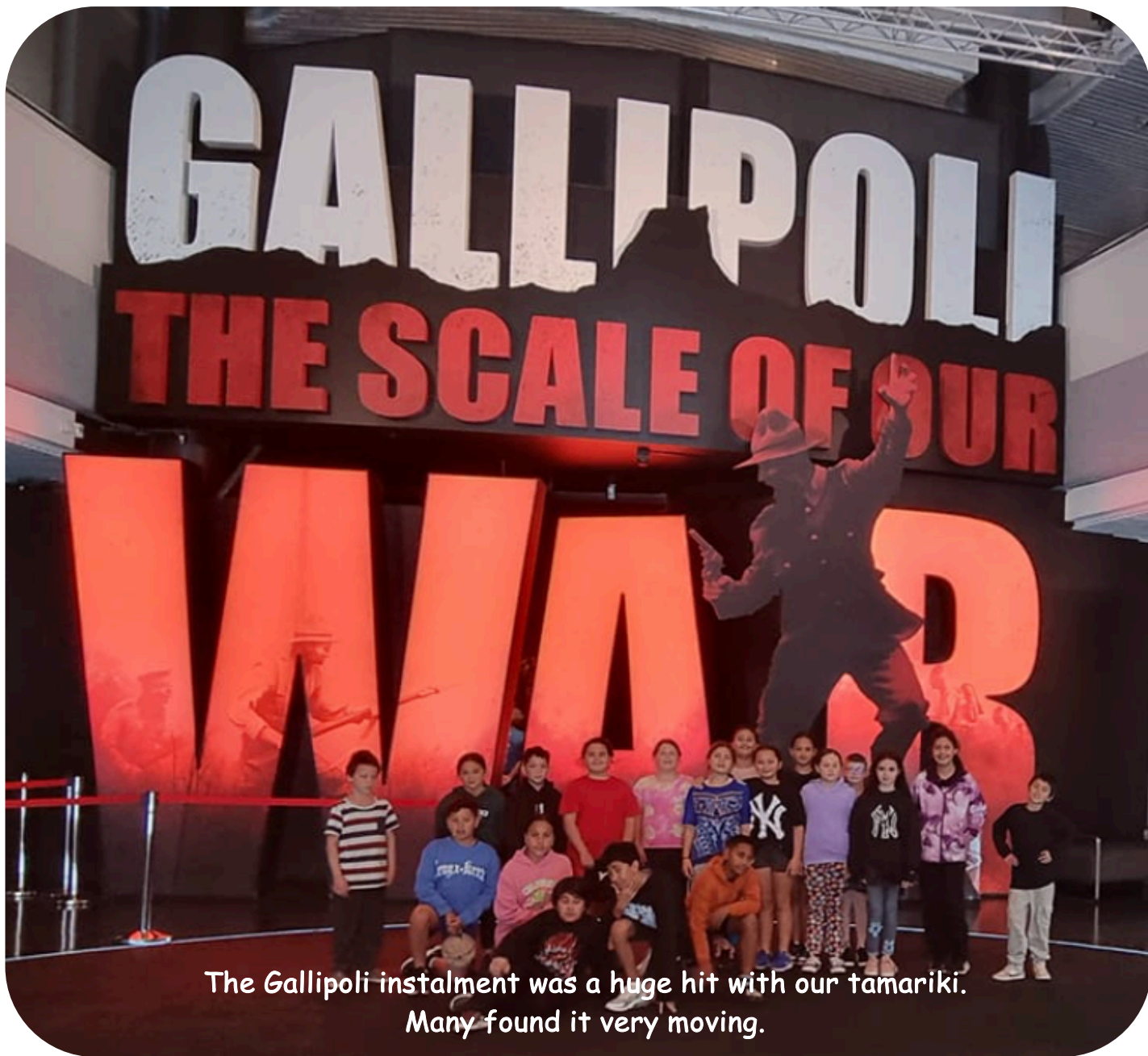
Whakatauki

Media stars in the making at Capital E. This was so popular. We have a green screen and plenty of cameras at Taramoa Strathmore to make this a reality.

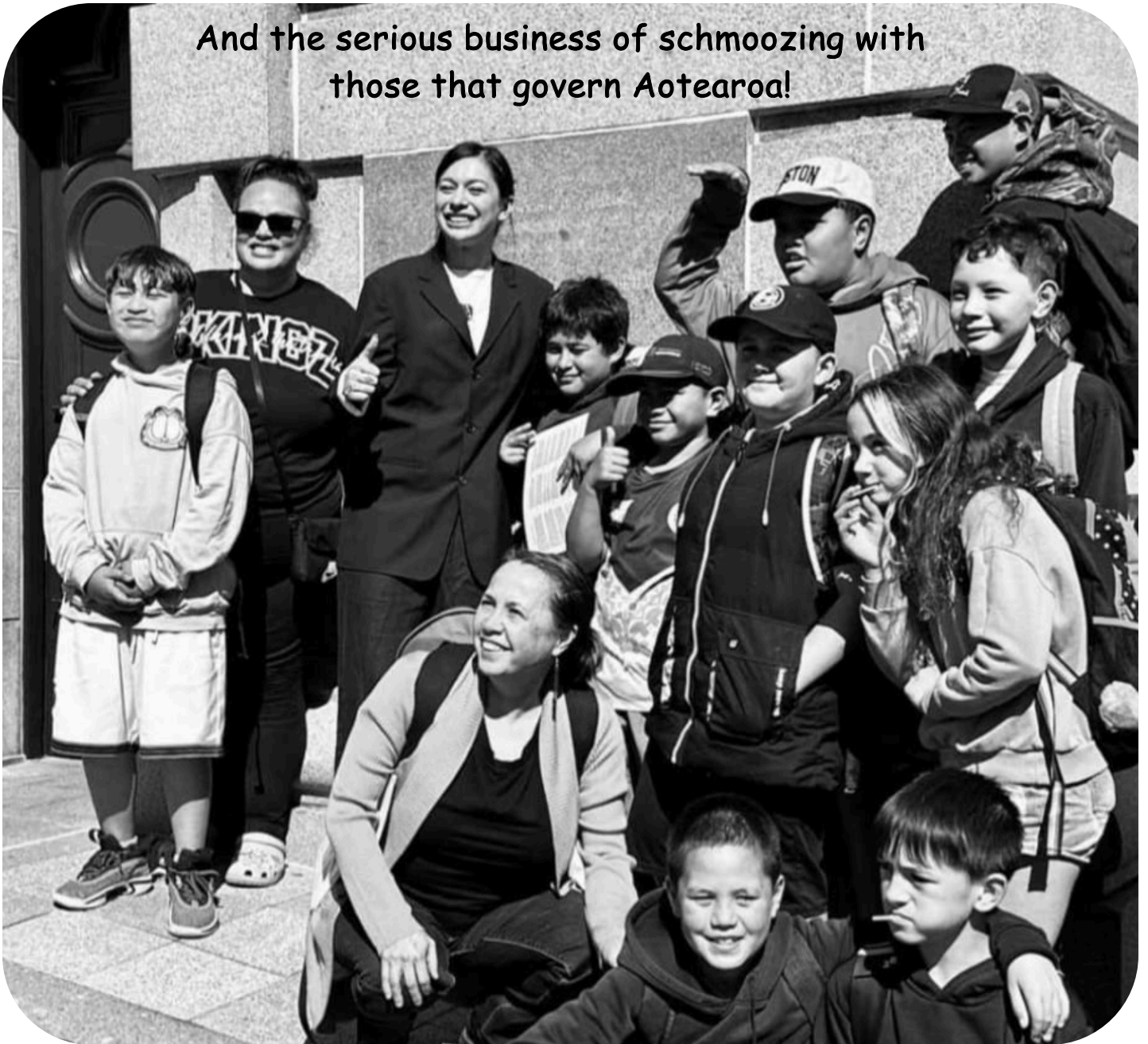

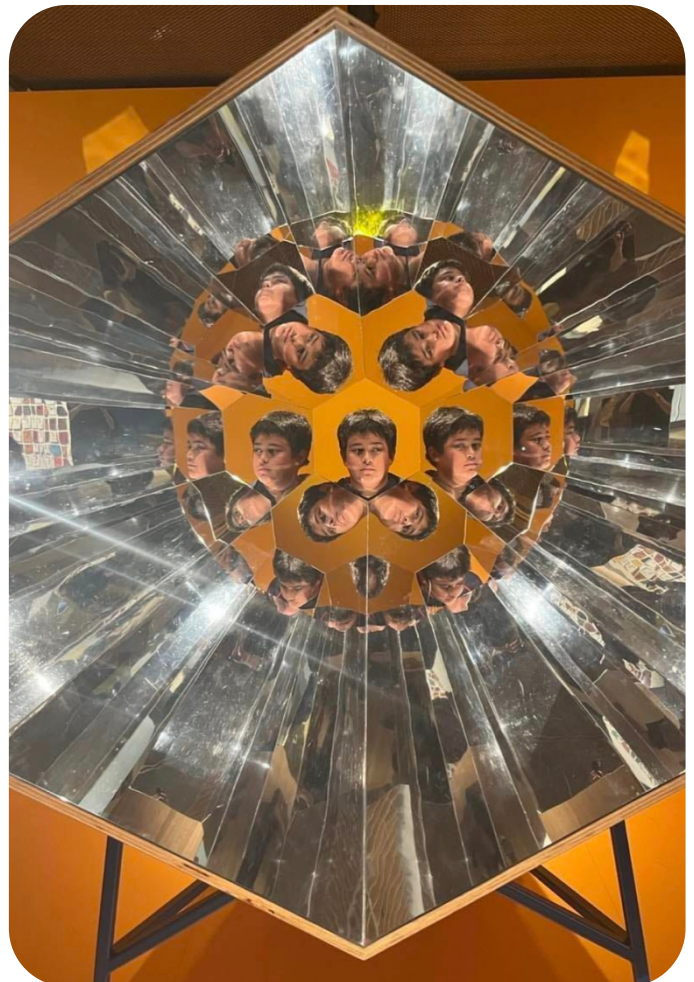

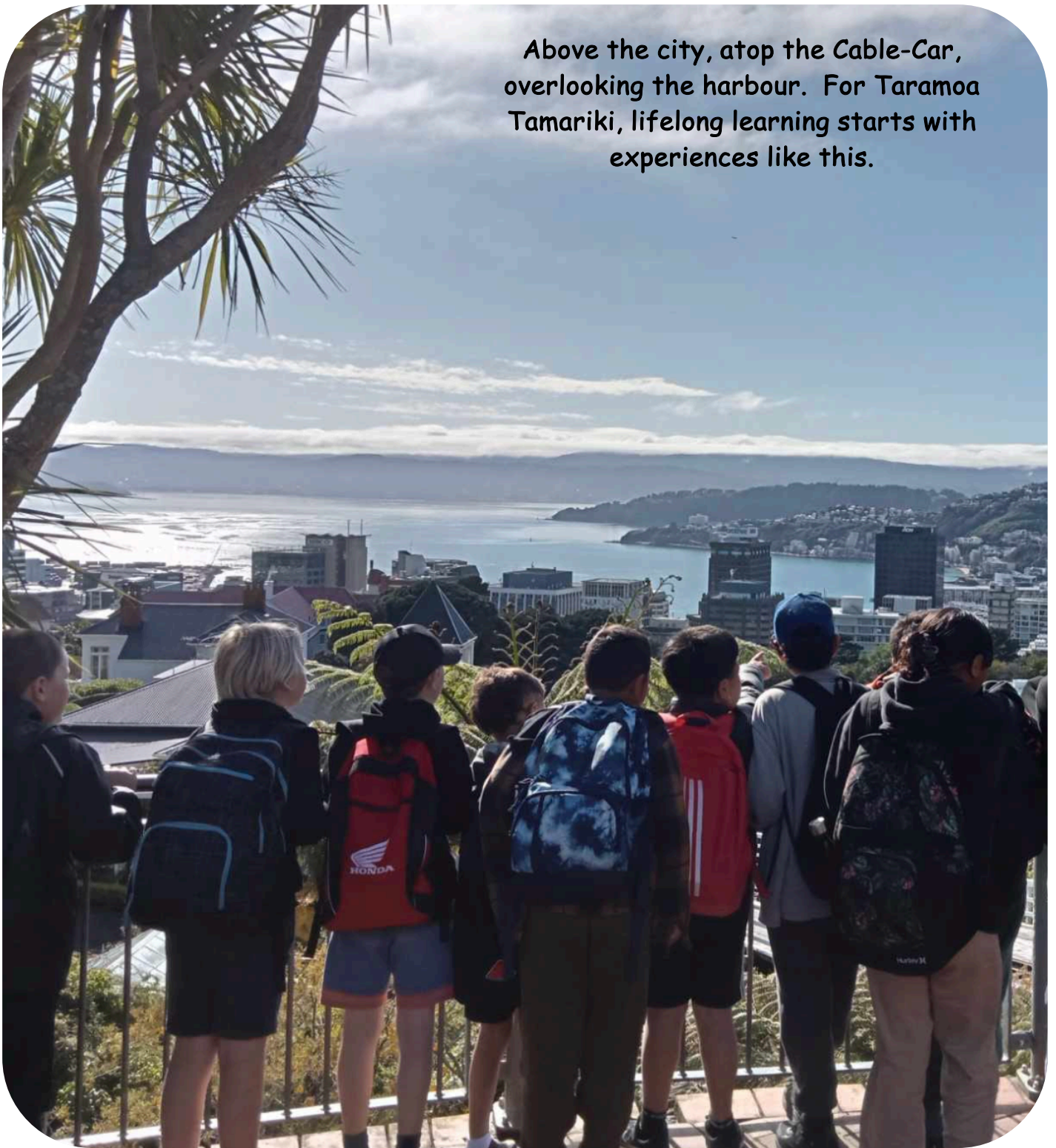
Up in Space ~ at least, up the hill at the Space Museum!







Above the city, atop the Cable-Car, overlooking the harbour. For Taramoa Tamariki, lifelong learning starts with experiences like this.



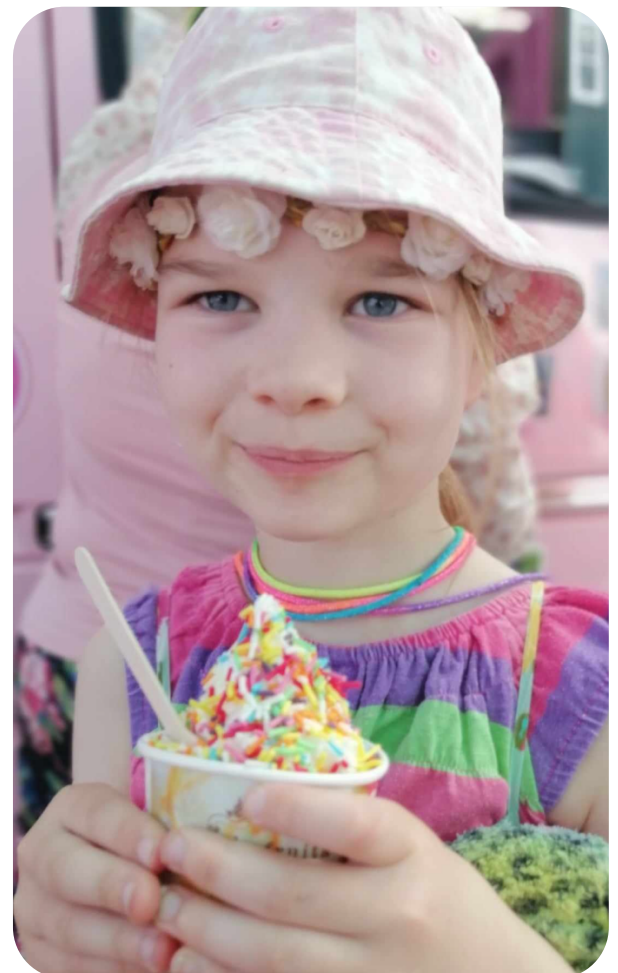
For our YR6 tamariki, this is their last camp with Taramoa Strathmore. For our YR4s, this is only the first!

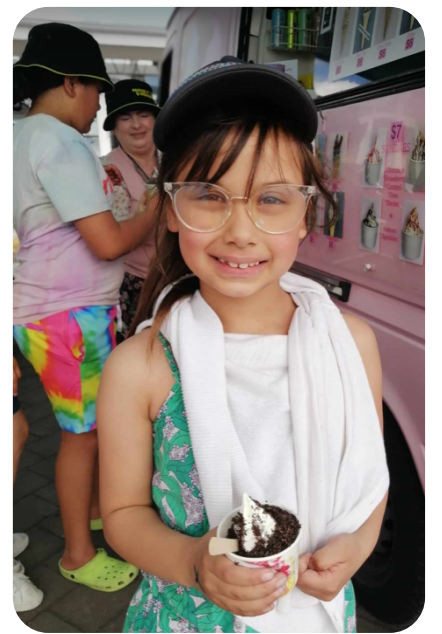
Let's also celebrate our juniors who had a wonderful week back at school where lifelong learning begins.
